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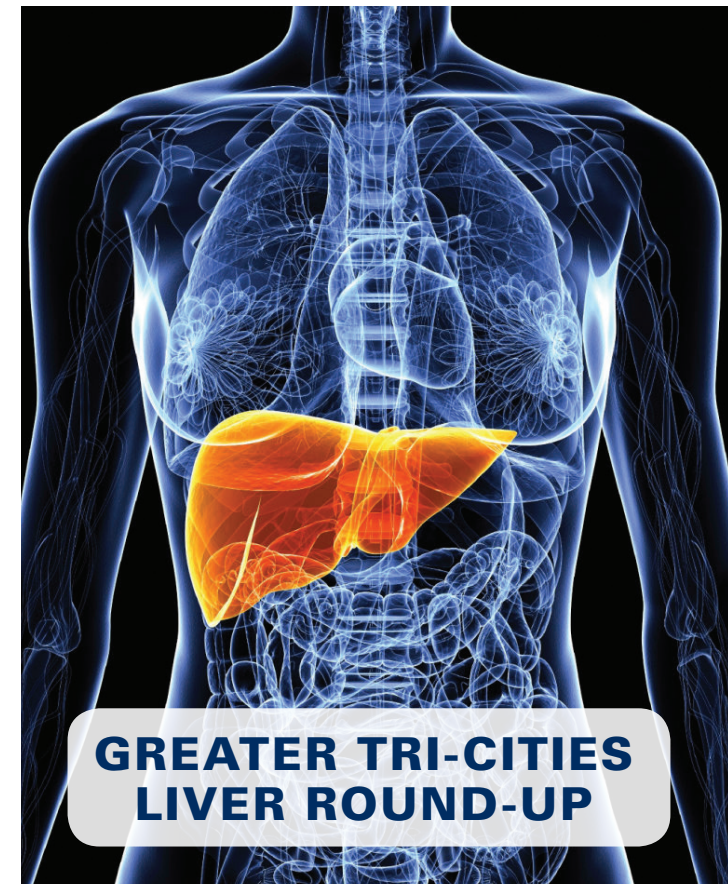

New information regarding the management of GI bleeding, *Helicobacter pylori* treatment, diagnosis and management of inflammatory bowel disease, viral hepatitis, NAFLD, cirrhosis and liver cancer will be presented. In addition case based discussion on the current approach to using biologics in IBD, DAA for hepatitis C, management of NAFLD, quality care in cirrhosis and screening and treatment of liver cancer will be presented.

Following this course, the participants will understand and be able to implement:

- Latest developments in the management of GI bleeding and IBD
- Latest evidence-based management of viral hepatitis
- Approach to the diagnosis and management of NAFLD and NASH
- How to diagnose and manage complications of cirrhosis
- Latest evidence-based strategies for liver cancer screening and management.

This course is directed to family and general practitioners, gastroenterologists, internists, nurses and other primary care providers including nurse practitioners and physician assistants interested in expanding their knowledge of clinical hepatology.

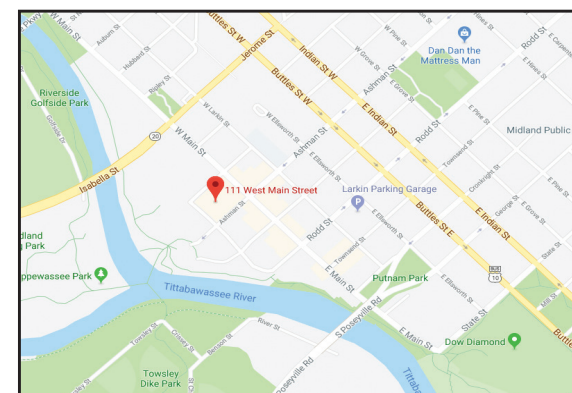
