Allergy Specialty Clinic & Food Allergy Clinic

The Food Allergy Clinical Service (FACS) is progressing into its eleventh year with Marc McMorris, M.D., as Director and Nancy Polmear-Swendris, MS, RN as Food Allergy Clinical Program Coordinator. Elizabeth Hudson, MPH, RD continues to assist our patients/families with their nutritional needs. Georgiana (Gigi) Sanders was named the Director of Clinical Research at the Mary H. Weiser Food Allergy Research Center. Erin Pianelli Lohrum, BSN, RN transitioned into a new role as the Food Allergy Research Nurse in the Allergy division. Sanders will soon be starting a clinical trial: Peanut Allergy Oral Immunotherapy Study of AR101 for Desensitization in Children and Adults (the PALISADE Study). We are one of 50 sites participating internationally. In November, The University of Michigan Division of Allergy and Clinical Immunology was selected as a FARE Clinical Network Center of Excellence. There are currently 25 members.

Endowment

The Endowment continues to partially fund one fellowship position. We truly appreciate the dedication and generosity of our alumni to make this possible. However, in order to fully fund a fellowship position, we need your help to reach the goal of a \$1.8 million endowment base in order to fully fund a fellowship position. At the end of last year we rolled out a competition among alumni split by Michigan residents (Blue team led by Dr. Alan Baptist) and non-Michigan residents (Maize team led by Dr. Travis Miller) to see which group could raise the most funds for the endowment. 
The Training Program's 2nd year fellows are Christopher Couch and Pooja Oza.
