- To look into the management of chronic non-malignant pain in the primary care setting and develop tools to make that easier for primary care physicians.
- To look at the experience of patients with chronic non-malignant pain and determine what factors make the difference to them in the care they receive.
- To explore behavior change as it relates to improved chronic pain management.
- To explore the concept of provider wellness and research what contributes to its presence or absence and what interventions are helpful in improving.
