Learning, Growing, and Thriving During a Pandemic PART 3

The journey through the pandemic continues. Looking back on the 2020/2021 academic year, our students completed classes through a variety of modalities including in-person, remote, and hybrid. The small size of our student cohort allowed us to conduct many of the “GC student dedicated courses” in-person, while slightly larger courses, including those taken together with other graduate students, were conducted remotely. Students completed clinical rotations through a variety of modalities, with some occurring in-person in Ann Arbor, Detroit, Grand Rapids, Dearborn, and Toledo and others occurring remotely at sites near and far in Ann Arbor, Salt Lake City, and Milwaukee. We anticipate that summer clinical rotations will again be diverse in terms of their locations, modalities, and specialties, with some students spending the summer here in Ann Arbor, while others are planning for rotations in Virginia, Iowa, Utah, and Washington (fingers crossed!).

As we plan for the Fall Term 2021, we are encouraged by the foundational expectations, announced by University of Michigan President, Dr. Mark Schlissel. 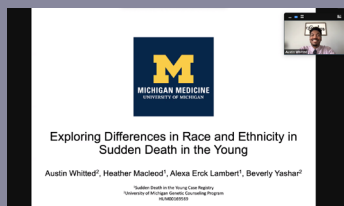
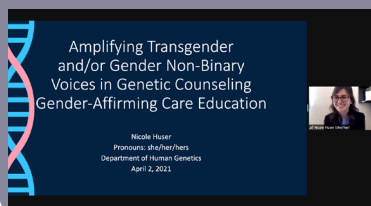

Of particular note, current students and alumni spoke highly of the mentorship and support they received from program leadership and faculty, with appreciation for the ease of communication and our approachability, including our “open door” policy. Reviewers also noted the value of the interdisciplinary interactions with students and faculty from other disciplines in the basic sciences, public health, social work, etc. The reviewers were also impressed by the clinical and research opportunities available to our students, both in Ann Arbor and at affiliated sites. The strength of our alumni community was noted as an important asset to our program, with alumni from across the country contributing to the clinical, research, classroom, and professional development of current and prospective UMGCP students. We really appreciate the strong connections our alumni have maintained with each other and the program through their careers. As the alumni association says, “Wherever you go-GO BLUE!”

At the end of the day, our clinical supervisors, classroom faculty, research mentors, students, and staff are at the heart of what makes our program so special. We can’t thank you enough. Working Together for Change

This past year has challenged us to recommit to developing and enacting a thoughtful plan to foster diversity, equity, inclusion and justice within our program, our community, and our profession. Finding the solutions requires us to be reflective about the history of who we are and forward-thinking about how to bring about meaningful change. Our efforts are multifaceted: multiple members of the class of 2021 used their thesis work to build an evidence-base that will enable us to promote equity in the provision of genetic services. Work by Austin Whitted looked at racial and ethnic disparities in the incidence of sudden cardiac death in you in the US, investigation by Michael Restrepo examined patient population specific understanding of variants of uncertain significance, and a study by Hiam Abdel-Salam looked at family communication about cancer in Arab Americans.

Engaging our communities is critical to this work. Nicole Huser’s thesis work, Amplifying Transgender and Gender Non-Binary Voices in Genetic Counseling Gender-Affirming Care Education, exemplifies the power of partnerships. Nicole assembled a multidisciplinary committee of genetic counselors, physicians, and members of the transgender non-binary community (TGNB) to envision and execute an ambitious project aimed to improve the quality of gender-affirming care provided by cancer genetic counselors. Importantly, her work was guided by a community advisory board composed of four diverse TGNB community members recruited through national TGNB social platforms. Nicole built and implemented a multicomponent intervention focused on TGNB health education. Her goal was to promote the adoption of and conversation about gender-affirming counseling practices in the genetic counseling profession. Preliminary data has demonstrated a substantive impact of this educational intervention on the clinical competence and confidence of those who participated. Multiple funding groups helped Nicole attain her objectives, including the NSGC Cancer SIG, the Jane Engelberg Memorial Fellowship and the Michigan Association of Genetic Counselors. We hope to make Nicole’s educational intervention available to additional genetic counselors in the future.



Summer GC Interest Group

The University of Michigan Genetic Counseling Program will be conducting our 8th annual UM Summer Genetic Counseling Interest Group for individuals considering entering the profession. During the months of June, July and August, we will be meeting one evening per month via Zoom. The goals of the discussions are to increase participants’ vocabulary related to genetic counseling and allow for interactions with practicing genetic counselors at the University of Michigan. Topics discussed during the Zoom calls are expected to cover multiple areas of clinical genetic/genomic practice.
