U-M Urologists respond to release of 'Surgeon Scorecard'

U.S. News and World Report published an editorial written by Drs. Khurshid Ghani, James Montie and David Miller on the pros and cons of a "Surgeon Scorecard" developed and released by ProPublica, an investigative journalism group.

The release of the rankings, which specified surgeon-specific outcomes for eight different elective procedures, engendered strong reactions from both proponents and opponents of the scorecard. U.S. News and World Report felt the U-M Urologists' response presented an even-handed assessment of the effort by ProPublica.
