It is with great sadness that we share the news of the recent passing of **Dr. Stephen A. Swisher** (class of 1998). From Nov-Dec 2023, senior resident **Matt Basinger** traveled to Nepal to obtain additional training in high-altitude and high-angle search and rescue, as part of the Nepal Diploma in Mountain Medicine (DiMM) certification. With support from Michigan Medicine, as well as from the American Alpine Club and The North Face, he was in Nepal for five weeks, where Matt learned from physicians specialized in altitude medicine and Nepalese mountain guides in rock/ice/snow rescue and wilderness stabilization. He traveled to 20,000 feet on the slopes of Chulu Far East and the Khangla Glacier to practice crevasse and high-altitude rescue, as well as work with helicopter rescue operations. He aims to take this training and become the medical director of a search and rescue team, or of a national park, and hopes to return to the Nepal in the near future to work for the Himalayan Rescue Association during mountaineering season. Matt will continue his Emergency Medicine career at Trinity Health Ann Arbor and Chelsea after graduation in June 2024.




Department Updates - Our Faculty

In 2023, our department produced an impressive tally of <u>358</u> peer-reviewed journal articles across our faculty!



The top 5 journals where our work is frequently published are Stroke, Annals of Emergency Medicine, JAMA Network Open, Resuscitation, and Western Journal of Emergency Medicine.

Congratulations to Dr. Marie Lozon on her Retirement!

Please join us in congratulating Dr. Marie Lozon, Professor of Emergency Medicine and Pediatrics, and Chief of Staff for Clinical Affairs, on her retirement after 33 years of service at Michigan Medicine. Dr. Lozon's retirement begins January 15, 2024. She began her career at the University of Michigan when she joined the faculty at the University of Michigan in 1991, after having trained at the University of Chicago in Pediatrics followed by fellowship training in Pediatric Emergency Medicine. She was the among the founding faculty of the Department of Emergency Medicine, leading the Division of Pediatric Emergency Medicine (PEM) from the Department's founding in 1999 to 2016, when she transitioned to institutional leadership roles as the Associate Chief Clinical Officer of the Children's and Women's hospitals and the Associate Chief of Staff in the Office of Clinical Affairs. She was elected Chief of Staff in 2018 and again in 2021.

Throughout her tenure at Michigan Medicine, she has served on many institutional committees, including as chair of the Executive Committee on Clinical Affairs. She led efforts to re-write the Medical Staff Bylaws, adopted in 2021. She co-created the Healthcare Administration Scholars Program (HASP), with former Chief Medical Officer Dr. Jeffrey Desmond, in 2007, and co-leads the program to this day. She has been involved in UMH Disaster preparedness efforts for decades and her scholarly pursuits include both the study of and advocacy for the inclusion of children in disaster and pandemic preparedness and response. She has lectured and consulted on pediatric preparedness at regional, national, and international conferences and participated in deployments, such as leading a UMH multidisciplinary team to respond to the Haitian earthquake in 2010. She will continue to pursue improvements in preparedness with federal agencies as an Emerita Professor.

We know many of you have worked with Marie and share our deep gratitude for her transparent, honest, and principled leadership style, her perseverance and positive approach, and her partnership and commitment through the years.
