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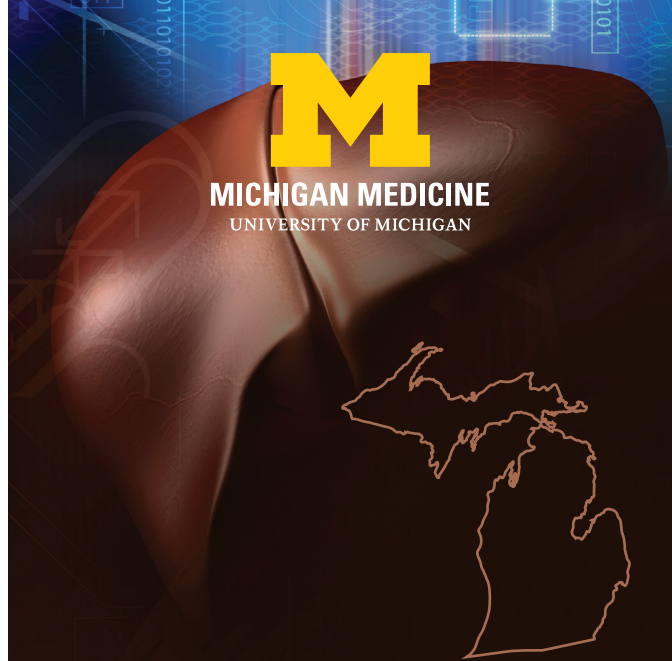

COURSE DESCRIPTION

New information regarding the management of hepatitis C, patients with hepatic steatosis, and alcoholic liver disease will be presented. In addition, case based discussions on the current approach to patients with hepatitis C and fatty liver disease will be presented.

Following this course, the participants will understand and be able to implement:

- Latest developments in the use of oral antiviral agents for chronic HCV including patients with renal failure and decompensated cirrhosis

- Approach to the diagnosis of non-alcoholic fatty liver disease including the use of medical and behavioral approaches
- Use of medical, radiological, and surgical therapies for patients with benign liver masses
- Indications and outcomes with EUS and ERCP for benign and malignant pancreaticobiliary disease including the use of gallbladder stents
- Novel biomarkers to detect and monitor alcoholic liver disease and the latest approach to facilitating abstinence via anti-craving agents

This course is directed to family and general practitioners, gastroenterologists, internists, nurses and other primary care providers including nurse practitioners and physician assistants interested in expanding their knowledge of clinical hepatology.

Accreditations & Credit Designation
