Movember Partnerships

In addition to actively working with the Movember Foundation in various forms (notably, the \$1.6 million grant for prostate cancer survivorship research), the Department of Urology has been an active participant in the annual Movember fundraising and awareness campaign, and in recent years, this has involved partnering with U-M teams in the awareness efforts.

In 2015, the Department joined members of the baseball, hockey and lacrosse teams to participate in various Movember challenges. This included the "Move" challenge, which encouraged participants to be more active, and the "Mustache" challenge, which encouraged participants to grow out facial hair to raise awareness for men's health issues.

As you can see in the image below, the efforts on the latter challenge were (for the most part) very respectable.




Big House 5K



Last year, the Department of Urology was a featured charity in the Trail to the Victors Big House 5K, an annual road race that raises money for local non-profits. Our Department joined other local charities such as the Community Action Network and North Star Reach Camp in raising more than \$115,000 in support of our collective efforts.

This road race, which takes place annually in April, sees runners weave through the University of Michigan campus before returning to the Big House to run down the stadium tunnel and out onto the field for the course's final stretch.
