Pediatric Diabetes Program

The Division of Pediatric Psychology at Michigan Medicine invites applications for a faculty appointment (open rank) within the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Michigan Medical School. Michigan Medicine is located in Ann Arbor, a vibrant and diverse community consistently rated as one of the best places to live in the United States.

The division seeks a pediatric psychologist to join the <u>Comprehensive Pediatric Diabetes</u> Program. Our multidisciplinary team evaluates approximately 120-150 newly diagnosed children each year and provides ongoing care to more than 1,500 children and adolescents with diabetes. Clinical effort will be directed toward providing behavioral health services to youth with diabetes during routine outpatient, multidisciplinary clinic visits, inpatient admissions at the time of initial diagnosis or disease exacerbation, and through the Pediatric Psychology Outpatient Clinic, as indicated. Based on the background of the candidate, effort will be allocated to allow opportunity to engage in extramurally funded research/scholarly activity that aligns with the overall objectives and activities of the Division of Pediatric Psychology, Division of Pediatric Endocrinology and the Elizabeth Weiser Caswell Diabetes Institute.

The administrative home of the successful candidate would be the <u>Division of Pediatric</u>

<u>Psychology</u>, which is comprised of over 20 faculty who are fully integrated into pediatric subspecialty areas, and have close and supportive working relationships with both community pediatricians and hospital-based physician specialists.

Supervision and training for pediatric psychology postdoctoral fellows, interns, advanced practicum students, pediatric house officers, and medical students is expected.

Applicants should possess a doctoral degree from an APA/CPA-accredited program and internship, postdoctoral training in pediatric psychology and be licensed or license-eligible as a psychologist in the state of Michigan. Successful applicants will have clinical experience working with children, adolescents and families living with diabetes. Experience in program development, implementation and clinical research is also desired. Faculty rank and compensation will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

The review process will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Applicants should send a CV and letter of interest to Emily Fredericks, Ph.D., Director, Division of Pediatric Psychology (emfred@med.umich.edu).
