All AATA buses have low-floor vehicles and have a ramp for wheel-chair access. AATA also provides door-to-door service to eligible individuals whose disabilities prevent them from riding the regular route buses. A-Ride trips are provided in accessible vehicles at a reduced cost. You must have a valid A-Ride I.D. to use A-Ride services. You can call for an ADA Eligibility Application or download it online. Professional certification of a disability is required as part of the application process.

All of SMART's buses are equipped with lifts or ramps to accommodate wheelchairs and scooters, as well as for those using canes and walkers. All of SMART's bus stops with a shelter are considered ADA and wheelchair accessible. Upon approval, door to door service can be requested.
